We hope MAW23 measures up.





Measure asks a seemingly simple question - What counts?

The paradox of measurement is that to make something known it must be countable, but things that are difficult to count are the things that tend to go uncounted. What we notice and value is central to how we live. From the quantifiable to the ineffable, what the assembled exhibits, performances, screenings and talks in Measure share above all, is that they are all points of departure, not points of arrival. If the cynic knows the price of everything and the value of nothing, how do we measure better?

PUNCHCARD

Side Gallery

50 artists, 15 mins, £2.60....

PUNCHCARD is a mail art project inspired by the Structurally F cked Report into artists pay and conditions. The report highlights the shockingly low pay of artists which averages £2.60 per hour. How to close the artist pay gap on the cheap? We asked 50 artists to make art quicker, in this case, produce an A5 postcard in under 15 minutes so they work at the equivalent minimum wage rate of £10.42 per hour. Will the result be hurried? Stressed? Half-baked and halffinished? Or will ideas of pride or hope labour mean that artists cheat themselves out of their own time? In short, do we get what we pay for?



The culmination of the New Graduate Award marks a significant point in their artistic practice; they have begun their independent studio practice, now removed from familiar structural frameworks and placed within a working environment, where they need to carve out their own time & space. "The New Graduate Award" is an invitation to join these artists at the beginning of their journey as they venture forth, navigating the ever-evolving landscapes of the creative ecologies, art world politics, practice based studio work and day to day balance of becoming an artist.

Each clip lasts about 19 seconds, which is apparently the length of time someone looks at an artwork in a gallery.

Three artists' works pull on time and space in three different ways. Rong Bao's hypnotic and unnerving Fragile invites contemplation on the paradox of effort and the acceptance of impermanence, and on the beauty that can be found in moments of both triumph and defeat. Created by someone who feels on the edge - of both land and socioeconomic systems, a precarious repetition is at the heart of Jacob Talkowski's art, using the mundane form of takeaway boxes. Olivia Louvel's Doggerland steps back in time to reveal the ancient Dogger-land which once linked Britain to the continent. The work questions our connection to the continent, and situates ourselves – as islanders – in this transitory zone: our political exit from the EU. What is your relationship to the continent?

The Optical Mechanical draws you in through animation, sound and factory transformations, exploring the temporal aspects of production. Using voices and animation to explore the tempo and energy of each apparatus, the work simulates the synchronised spectacle of automation. Exploring the relationship of both human and machine, the rhythmical energy of the installation beats ever louder and stronger, pounding with the pulse of time itself.

The Optical Mechanical was first commissioned by the National Festival of Making with support from Arts Council England, Deco Publique, Super Slow Way and Creative Lancashire.

Authorless Bricolage is an ongoing research project by Cal Dyer, a term he first coined in 2014 whilst working on steel as a means to accurately delineate recurring visual traces within the public domain, created over time simply through existence. For MAW23 Cal Dyer will reproduce a large billboard through large format digital print. The print will become a live work, activated and added to throughout the festival by the artist and collaborators.

In 2030 Middlesbrough will be 200 years old. Working towards this bicentenary, Jason Hynes has begun a project creating a series of portraits of people who view Middlesbrough as their home town. Personal handwritten memories of the town from each person are exhibited alongside each person's large scale portrait. The project celebrates and explores concepts around identity, place, memory and time.



Road-side Billboard 5 166 Stockton Road, TS5 4AD 24/7

Derived from observations made in transit, these motion-blurred vistas are digital manipulations of historically significant 19th Century oil landscapes, captured as if moving at high velocity through these idyllic rural environments. Paintings by artists expressing a romantic outlook of tranquillity and country life, are reconsidered in relation to a modern romance with speed and the rapid pace of contemporary experience.

Symbols of Lexeme

Main Gallery

Stephen Irving

The symbols of Lexeme date back to before Ancient Egypt, yet can be seen within artwork and literature throughout human history. Some believe these symbols formed one of the earliest religions based on the belief that through darkness there is always light, some believe them to be evidence of visitors from another planet, but there is universal agreement that each of these symbols represents a different Lexeme within our language. For example, pain can mean painful, painless, to cause pain etc etc creating an ambiguity that creates more questions than answers.

Artist Stephen Irving will be exploring the ideas and concepts created through these symbols, as well as the symbols themselves, through a series of new original artwork as well archival footage and imagery that he has collected through his research.



Perpetual Arrival conceives of the creative process as a continuum punctuated by a series of moments - or arrivals - when circumstances converge to result in something which is generally agreed to constitute a work of art. We pursue our lines of enquiry, research our subject matter, marshal our evidence, manipulate and explore our materials. Periodically we arrive at something which is often treated as though it were a conclusion, but the reality for many of us is actually that it is just one point of arrival among a lifetime of similar arrivals and departures. We move on to create other points of arrival. Arrivals can act as a break, a chance to take stock, to stand back and learn from the intervening time and process. Then we move on.
